In this talk Jason Wright will use William Blake's illustrations of the book of Job to articulate how through these two personal and social struggles we come to accept our place in a changing context, develop participatory communal and individual relationships and bear to live a creative life. Particular attention will be paid to how these ideas can inform and support our practice in the consulting room as individuals and group psychotherapists.

The central concept for this idea lies in the work of Alfred North Whitehead who suggests that life is symbiotic, creative and evolute, driven by valuing the creative and emerging moment. What clearer description might there be for our work in the consulting room.

Jason Wright is a Transpersonal and Psychoanalytic Psychotherapist, and author. For twelve years, he was Clinical Director and CEO for the CORE Trust the holistic addictions charity. Prior to this, he was a company manager, producer and director in theatre.
